



ewcastle United, the 2012 winners, will face Asian champions Guangzhou Evergrande, HKFA U-23 and our own Hong Kong Football Club in Group A of the 15th HKFC Citibank Soccer Sevens, which will be held from Friday to Sunday, May 23-25.

Chelsea are the top seeds in Group B and will face fellow English Premier League team Sunderland, Hong Kong champions Kitchee and the HKFC Captain's Select in the 16-team Main competition.

Manchester City, who are making only their second appearance in the event, head Group C where they'll take on two-time finalists Rangers of Scotland, a second HKFA First Division club and Singapore Cricket Club.

Holders Leicester City celebrated promotion to the Premier League last month and will begin the defence of their Hong Kong title with Group D matches against five-time champions Aston Villa, HKFA U-21 and Yau Yee League Select. The Official Draw for both the Main and Masters competitions was held last month at Hong Kong Football Club and set the scene for another thrilling three days of seven-a-side action.

Chelsea will be a huge draw as they return after last playing two years ago, while the six other British clubs all competed last May, when Leicester beat Newcastle 2-0 in the Cup final, which proved a lucky omen ahead of their successful bid for promotion. The seven British clubs will field players up to U-21 level.

Tony Bratsanos, Chairman of the HKFC Soccer Sevens Organising Committee, says he's pleased by the increasing quality and diversity of the competition.

"I think we have one of our strongestever line-ups this year, with Chelsea and Manchester City representing two of world football's biggest clubs, defending champions Leicester City, former winners Newcastle United and Aston Villa, two-time finalists Rangers, and Sunderland," Bratsanos said.

"Guangzhou Evergrande's debut is a sign of the tournament's increasing regional appeal, while we're also proud that we'll again have four professional clubs and three amateur teams from Hong Kong in the Main tournament, as well as Singapore Cricket Club.

"We're especially delighted that Citibank is title sponsoring the tournament for a fourth straight year and we thank them and all of our other top-level sponsors for their fantastic support of the event. Due to arguably our strongest-ever line-up of teams, we're expecting greater demand than ever for tickets and a packed-out stadium."

China challengers, Hong Kong hopes

Guangzhou Evergrande – whose first team won the AFC Champions League last November after their third successive Chinese Super League title – will make their debut under Zhou Suian. "We're preparing a young team to compete in the Soccer Sevens and although it's our first time in the tournament, we want to do well because we're not only representing the club but also Chinese and Asian football," said Zhou, the club's U-17 head coach.

"We have a difficult group. Newcastle are very famous, have a great history and are the 2012 champions, so I think they'll be favourites to win the group, but the teams from Hong Kong will also be strong, especially as they will be playing at home and are familiar with the tournament."

Along with top pro teams from England, Scotland and China, Hong Kong will again have a strong presence in the tournament. Mark Sutcliffe, Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Football Association, was confident the city would be well represented by local champions Kitchee, another pro club, and HKFA U-23 and U-21 teams.

"Kitchee won the HKFC Citibank Soccer Sevens in 2011 and as Hong Kong champions, we expect them to have a strong side, while we're happy to field two HKFA age-group sides as this will help develop some of the city's most promising talent," Sutcliffe said.

"The HKFC Citibank Soccer Sevens is one of the city's most popular annual tournaments for local players and fans, and we expect another fantastic three days at Hong Kong Football Club."

Stars to shine in the Masters

Rangers Legends will begin the defence of their Masters title with Group A matches against Wallsend Boys Club and Hong Kong sides USRC (United Services Recreation Club) and Kowloon Cricket Club. Rangers are looking for a third Cup success, after first winning the Masters in 2008.

Aegon Ajax All Stars, the 2012 champions and last year's runners-up, were drawn in Group B with top local contenders Eastern Salon and two of our own Club teams – HKFC Veterans and HKFC Chairman's Select.



'Big Ron' in the house

Ron Atkinson will be the guest speaker at the always-popular Sportsman's Dinner, which will be held in the Club's own Sports Hall on Thursday evening, May 22). Atkinson, 75, played professionally for over a decade before making his name in management, then later became a popular TV pundit.

Popularly known as 'Big Ron', Atkinson is best known for his managerial career, particularly for his five years in charge of Manchester United (1981-86). Atkinson led Manchester United to FA Cup victories in 1983 and 1985, while in the First Division his side finished third in the 1981-82 and 1982-83 seasons before finishing fourth for three straight campaigns.

Atkinson had previously managed Kettering Town, Cambridge United and then West Bromwich Albion, leading the Baggies to fourth place in 1981. After Manchester United, he managed Sheffield Wednesday, Aston Villa – leading them to second place in the 1992-93 Premier League – Coventry City and finally Nottingham Forest.

Before moving into management, Atkinson spent the majority of his playing career for Oxford United, making over 500 appearances in all competitions in 12 seasons. Playing as wing-half, he was nicknamed 'The Tank' and he captained the side in their rise to the Second Division before moving into management in 1971 at the age of 32.

England legend Peter Beardsley and former Villa and Celtic midfielder Alan Thompson will spearhead the Wallsend Boys Club as they make their debut, while Forest Mobsters will include former England centre-back Des Walker, towering striker Jason Lee and defender Andy Todd.

Kevin Friend, one of the Premier League's top referees, will officiate at the tournament. While in Hong Kong, the 42-year-old will also work with local referees, sharing his expertise and experience of officiating at the highest level of the game, which has included the 2012 Community Shield and last year's League Cup final.

Now TV, Hong Kong's leading paid-TV broadcaster, will again cover the Soccer Sevens live. Regional broadcasters Fox Sports and Star Sports will air a two-hour programme in countries across Asia, while Chelsea and other British clubs will show their team's matches on their dedicated inhouse channels.

Citibank has title sponsored the event since 2011 and other sponsors this year include British Airways, Nike, Aegon, The Excelsior and Boase Cohen & Collins.

Walter Gerrard — Remembering the Buffalo

From Scott Semple:

t is with great sadness that the Soccer Section and HKFC community at large heard of the passing of one of Hong Kong's true characters, **Walter "Water Buffalo" Gerrard**. For those that don't know the story of Walter, he was one of the first professional overseas footballers to come and ply his trade in Hong Kong along with Derek Currie and Jackie Trainer. Walter, along with Derek and Jackie were pioneers of professional football in this city when all three of them signed for Hong Kong Rangers in 1970.

Many followed, including my Dad Billy Semple, Willie Henderson, Hugh McCrory, Tommy Hutchison, Gordon McQueen, George Best and Bobby Moore to name just a few! Those really were the halcyon days of football in Hong Kong and big Walter led the way. In his first season he scored a quite remarkable 37 goals as Rangers won the league for the only time in their history. He then moved onto Seiko and the success continued as the era of Seiko dominating Hong Kong football for a decade and a half got underway.

Personally to me and my family, Walter was a great friend and had quite an impact on my family's life.

My Dad often recalls the time he first met Walter, although not in Hong Kong but on a football pitch in Glasgow as they setup on opposite sides as youth players.

This was followed up many years later in Hong Kong as my Dad had transferred here to also play for Hong Kong Rangers. After a couple of seasons Seiko wanted to buy him, but the manager at the time blocked

tradition to honour the memory of a good man rather than to mourn his passing and Walter gave many countless memories... > >

the deal. We then left Hong Kong until a year or so later when Walter was assistant coach at Seiko and was instrumental in signing my Dad thus returning us all to Hong Kong once more where we then all lived for the next 10 years. These were very happy times indeed.

This was something I only found out recently and it makes me reflect on how my family's life would have turned out if Walter hadn't done what he did. So, for that alone my family and I owe him a huge debt.

Growing up in Hong Kong was all a bit of a blur as a young kid, but I have hazy memories of our families being together down at the "old" club. It was probably around this time that Walter had retired from the professional game and played for a spell with our very own Dynamics until injury prevented him from playing any more but from what I've heard he even helped coach the rugby team.

There have been fitting obituaries in both the SCMP here in Hong Kong and in the Scotsman back in birthplace of Scotland. If you have time it's worth looking them up on the internet but in the meantime I make no apologies for stealing some of the content. Here is one of his famous tales:

Famously, he played for Caroline Hill against Santos FC of Brazil, Pele and all, and told of the story of being substituted at the same time as the world's greatest-ever footballer. "Pele," he said, "these coaches don't know a good footballer when they see one". Priceless stuff from the big man.

In recent years I had the pleasure of attending the 30-year Seiko reunion as my Dad happened to be in town at the time. It was such good timing and wonderful to see all the players reunited once again; My Dad, Walter, Derek, Tim Bredbury as well as Walter's wife Barbara, plus their son Andrew. It was a fun night and true to form Walter got up on stage to sing a song.

I'll finish up by saying Walter's funeral at St. John's Cathedral last month in Central was full with some only able to find standing areas. It was a clear testament to how well liked and respected he was, from a boy born in Maryhill, Glasgow to the man that made a successful career, life and name for himself in Hong Kong.

If I can steal one more thing from the obituary, Derek Currie wrote in the SCMP:

"It is a good Scottish tradition to honour the memory of a good man rather than to mourn his passing and Walter gave many countless memories."

Hear, Hear!

From Tom Banks:

"1970 was a massive year for football. Brazil won the World Cup in Mexico, and Pele came to the Hong Kong Football Club to conduct a coaching clinic for HK Schools. Ian Petrie brought three young players to play for his team Rangers, and so began the professional era of Hong Kong Football. Being a Glasgow-born football daft kid of 11, I would try and see Rangers play at every opportunity, and I would regale tales to my classmates of the exploits of the flying winger Derek Currie, and the bustling striker Walter Gerrard who the press were calling "the water buffalo".

Imagine my joy when my late father Jimmy and mother Maggie befriended the Scots footballers, and they became firm family friends. We've all been saddened by the passing of Big Walter. Luckily, like many that knew him, we all have our memories and stories to tell of time spent in his company. My mother loves telling the story of the time she and dad were invited to a wine tasting at the Club organised by Walter. Jimmy Banks only drank whisky water (distilled), no ice, so there was no way he was going to a wine tasting.



Somehow Walter convinced him to attend, and he reluctantly entered the Club Restaurant where all the wines were laid out. As he approached the first table, Walter leaned down and lifted up a tablecloth revealing a case of (Ballantines) Whisky and he proceeded to pour my father a glass, and added some water. My dad wafted the glass under his nose and declared it had a wonderful bouquet.

Walter was a legend of Hong Kong football, but even when he retired he remained a larger than life character whose charm, wit and company were highly thought of. He will be very much missed by all that regarded him as a friend. Our condolences to Barbara and the boys."

From Bobby Lawson

"Walter always was the most "larger than life" character. He was legendary for his stories and would always have a word to say to you wherever and whenever he saw you.....of course we had football in common and those were in the days when HK football was genuinely popular so at any time when

the Club were in the first division. as seemed to be the case in alternate years in the mid 70's /early 80's, I would always be subject to Walter's advice as to how to get the better of the other professional teams in the first division. On one occasion after we had taken a point off Walter's old team Seiko he tried to claim all the credit for the fact that we man marked all their decent players including Derek Currie, defended on the edge of our own penalty area for almost the whole of the 90 minutes, rode our luck and ended up with 0-0 draw...Walter's remark was "I told you that you could get a point if you were brave and attacked them".

My abiding memory of Walter though, a number of years later, will be that when his son Andrew was playing in junior football and I was his coach, he came to every game that Andrew played and often told me to pay no attention to all the advice etc from the other parents who attended to watch their kids play......however after one game I reminded him of those comments after he spent most of the game telling me what I should do with the kids and his response was "ah yes Bobby but they don't know what they

are talking about but I do".

This was the type of comment which could only come from a wholly confident man.

It was the greatest pleasure to have known him."

From Mike Ashton:

"Walter Gerrard – the "Big Man" as teammate Derek Currie calls him, retired from professional football in Hong Kong after a great record for leading the line of top teams with distribution and goals – particularly with his head. He then made his transition into "civilian" life with ease, both professionally and socially, his ebullient personality and humour making him a popular figure indeed. I knew him when we played together for Dynamics social team and he was an outstanding contributor both as player and social catalyst.

There is one telling side to his character that might spark special interest – he was a "Big Man" and very powerful, but in the appropriate situation he could have also been called the "Gentle Giant" as revealed

to me on occasion when hot tempered men, much younger, got frustrated with his command of the ball in midfield (he had dropped back from his centre-forward role considering he was in his late 40s). They'd kick out and square up but Wally would calm them down with a pair of powerful paternal hands on their shoulders to let them see the light – he could have "murdered" them.

He was a Big Man, and Gentle Giant, in every sense of the expressions".

From Derek Currie:

"Being a member from the early 70's the Club was a great social outlet for Walter, where he met and made countless friends.

There was also great banter with the Rugby Section about which shape of the ball was better!

Always great competitiveness when playing against the Club at football, particularly when he lined up against Henrik Lorentz in goal. However the best part of the match, normally followed in the bar, afterwards."

HKFC vs Kitchee - Wednesday 26th March

fter having qualified through the Junior Shield, Club took on first division league leaders Kitchee in the first round of the FA Cup. Played at Mong Kok Stadium, this was a great opportunity for the boys to see how they would match up against arguably the best team in Hong Kong. Club started well and managed to get through the opening minutes with a clean sheet. The deadlock was however broken in the 8th minute when a quick turnover in possession led to Kitchee scoring the opener. Club held their head up high and almost equalized on the 14th minute when Carlo Dilibero's swirling free-kick forced out a sensational save from the Kitchee goalkeeper. Unfortunately it was Kitchee that doubled their lead after 37 minutes



when Club gave the ball away cheaply: 0-2. Minutes later, Kitchee should have been down to 10 men when **Rob Scott** got fouled after he had broken through the defence. Only a yellow card was shown however and the resulting free-kick led to nothing. Half-time score 0-2.

The second half started much the same as the first with Club keeping players behind the ball and looking for a quick counter attack. Kitchee was gifted a cheap penalty on the hour mark which was converted to make it 0-3. With Club tiring, Tony Sealy decided to make three quick changes bringing on Michael Liu, Gianni Melwani and Mike Wilson to replace Freek Schipper, Rob Scott and Gary Gheczy. This didn't stop Kitchee from adding a fourth after 82 minutes despite some great goalkeeping from **Issey Maholo** throughout the game. Minutes later it was 0-5 when one of



the Kitchee players curled the ball in the top corner. Club did have one more opportunity but **Amro Abbas**'s strike was well held by the Kitchee goalkeeper. Final score 0-5.

Overall a good performance by Club against a team that is made up of full-time professionals and is widely

regarded as the strongest side in Hong Kong. Club battled for the full 90 minutes and created a fair amount of chances playing free-flowing football from time to time. Club will now once again focus on the league where finishing top is still a real possibility.


Social game with Melbourne Cricket Club and HKCC on 5th April



What do you typically race?

In HK, I do the Revolution Asia Splash and Dash, and Ocean swim series, and the HK Tri Association triathlons. This year, I ran the Hong Kong Standard Chartered Marathon for the first time. I also like doing destination races, like the Phuket Triathlon, or the Cambodia half marathon. Racing provides a goal and a challenge to focus on, and they're also a lot of fun.

What does your training schedule look like?

I train with the Club 3 mornings a week from 6.30-8am and then once or twice over the weekend. I swim on Mondays and Fridays and run on Wednesday mornings, and at the weekend I try and get out for a bike ride and a run.

How do you prepare ahead of a big race?

I taper the week before a big race, reduce training by more than 50% and try to get as much sleep as possible. A lot of the HK races start at 6am, so I'm up at 4am to race... so getting to bed early is important. (I'm usually in bed immediately after my kids). The morning of the race, I run through my race check list to ensure I have all my kit, eat a bowl of porridge and then off I go.

Any special food/drinks you eat?

I try to eat protein soon after working out, and get lots of fruit and vegetables into my diet.

Any tips?

Setting challenging goals works for me. It gives me something to focus my energy on.

What do you typically race?

I am still discovering as I am still a beginner at this modality. Started off with 10k races and aquathon sprints, then headed to aquathon challenges and bigger swims. Did my first half marathon last February and who knows what comes next!

What does your training schedule look like?

Being more of a morning person and trying to consolidate with family, I try to get out there early mornings 4 times a week to go for a run or swim.

How do you prepare ahead of a big race?

I make sure I trained enough so I am prepared and can enjoy the race. And a good night's sleep before the big day.

Any special food/drinks you eat?

Nothing special, but I like my granola after exercise.

Any tips?

Still not an expert to give tips but follow your own rhythm and slowly build up. Register for a race so you have a goal to train for.

What do you typically race?

When I was younger I used to do mainly pool racing, focusing on distance freestyle (1500m, 400m) and butterfly (200m, 100m). Towards the end of university, I got involved in open water swimming (although the opportunities for this are more limited in the UK than in Hong Kong). Since moving to Hong Kong, climate and availability of competitions have led me to compete in more open water competitions, which includes the Cross Harbour swim and over a range of distances from 1500m to 15km.

What does your training schedule look like?

We have 5 pool sessions a week and work dependent I try to make it to at least 3, together with 1 or 2 open water swims at the weekend.

How do you prepare ahead of a big race?

Once the race season starts there tends to be a competition every week, which means it isn't possible to set training cycles and taper in the same way I would have for pool competition. I'll usually try to get an early night and make sure that I've got something for breakfast to give me some energy, without feeling too nauseous during the race.

Any special food/drinks you eat?

Nothing in particular. I've tried energy drinks and gels and found that they tend to give a spike of energy then leave me crashing, so over a longer race I find it better to maintain an even energy level.

Any tips?

I try to identify particular competitions to focus on in a season to try and gear my training accordingly (so focusing on distance, stamina or speed accordingly).

What do you typically race?

I mainly race triathlons (swim, bike, run), but I also do a few cycling or running events every year.

I'm generally better at longer events - maybe that's a testament to my stubbornness rather than skill. For triathlon, I prefer Ironman distance (3.8km swim, 180km bike, 42km run), for running I prefer marathons, and for cycling I prefer multi-day stage races.

What does your training schedule look like?

I try to do something every day, normally early in the morning before work. I'll usually break the week up into 3 bike rides, 3 runs and 2 swims. I also try to get a short gym session in 3



times a week. I normally do the shorter training (under 2 hour sessions) on weekdays, and leave the long stuff (3-5 hour sessions) to the weekends. I'll also often combine a long bike ride and a run on the weekend.

How do you prepare ahead of a big race?

Mainly by trying to eat healthy, fresh foods and avoid too much sugar, alcohol or processed foods, and to make sure I'm getting enough sleep. The training will often ramp up before a big race, so making sure I take care of my general health is important. And of course I've got to keep reminding myself it's all just for fun and not to take it too seriously.

Any special food/drinks you eat?

I mainly try to eat fresh and healthy foods, both in and out of the race. I was told that if you can't easily figure out where a food came from or what it contains you shouldn't eat it, and I think that's pretty good advice.

Any tips?

Plan a couple of big targets or events every year - it doesn't have to be a race, it can be any goal, then make a plan and work towards it.

And remember it's about enjoying yourself, both in training and in competition - we all have proper issues to worry about in the real world.

BOWLING TIPS

How do I adjust my footwork for sparing and striking?

If you are leaving a head pin (that's the pin closest to you) or other bowling pins on the left side, it's time to move your feet to the right of your normal bowling position on the lane approach. You can now roll your ball over your bowling strike mark and the bowling ball should go towards the left side. Your position on the approach will vary, depending on which bowling pins are left. The same will be true on the right side, you move to your left.

Besides moving right or left, you can also move forwards and backwards from your mark. If you move up, your

bowling ball is going to hit the bowling pins further down the bowling alley. The reverse is also true, if you back up your bowling ball will hit the bowling pins earlier.

In the situation that you have to spare a 10 or 7 pin (the two furthermost pins on the left and right sides), you will need to stand on the opposite side of the bowling approach, the last dot on the left or right, for example. Then roll over a different mark, you only use this for the 10 or 7 pin spare conversion."
