

THE THOUGHTS OF THE CHAIRMAN

主席的話

Welcome back to the **Club Magazine** after an absence of 5 months since March 2022. We suspended production of the magazine given the extent of the social distancing measures in place at the time, which impacted much of the social activities and in particular the sporting calendar, leaving little to report.

Happily, the situation is stabilised to such an extent that much of the sporting life is back on (albeit it is now the summer), and as at the time of writing, it has been announced that the flight bans are suspended, removing one particular stress factor affecting those of us who are returning to Hong Kong. It is therefore to be hoped that we can look forward to a full upcoming sporting season for the first time in 3 years!

The Sportsman's Bar project is now well underway with a current finalisation date of mid-December, although we are of course aiming to complete it as soon as possible. An issue that affects this is the supply chain disruption resulting from Covid, along with the need to comply with a number of local regulatory approvals upon completion. I am sure, however, that when the bar is fully reopened with the new kitchen facilities, the overall experience will be enhanced, setting us up well for the coming years.

Another important initiative is the **LED floodlight project for the Main Pitch** that will have started by the time you receive this magazine, which will see us working in liaison with the Jockey Club to upgrade the floodlighting around the Pitch. The work will be done in two phases with the floodlighting to the Forsgate Stand being addressed first, followed by the floodlighting to the South Stand. Whilst we will lose 50% of the floodlighting during these phased works, fortunately the lux levels from the remaining 50% of the floodlighting should be sufficient to enable pre-season training for both Rugby and Soccer to go ahead.

It was my privilege to attend the **Staff Awards** presentation on 20th June for both the **Employees of the Year** and the **Long Service Awards**. Our staff are the backbone of the Club and the reason why we can derive so much enjoyment. On the other side of the coin, on 14th July we held our annual **25 Year Members Reception** (which was held over from last year due to social distancing issues), which was attended by over 40 long serving members. We also took the opportunity to invite members who have been with the Club for 45+ years to honour their commitment. Of these, three members Tony Carroll, Dermot Agnew and Peter Olsen had reached 50 years of membership, a notable achievement. These events have been somewhat disrupted over the past 3 years, so it was great to have both staff and members attend such special occasions.

You should have received a newsletter on 25th July, regarding the launch of the **online booking system for Sports Facilities**, allowing Members to book through our website, in addition to telephoning or booking at the Sports Desk. In this magazine issue, you will find an informative guide on using this new booking tool.

經過5個月的休刊，「CLUB」會刊終於復刊。3月時因為社交距離措施繼續收緊，對眾多社交活動影響甚大，尤其是本會的體育賽事及活動減少，可供報導的新聞不多，所以會刊當時也要暫停出版。

幸好隨著疫情穩定下來，大家都陸續恢復投入各項體育活動及賽事（雖然現在正值暑假），下筆之際，政府亦宣布暫緩航班熔断機制，要回港的大家毋須再擔心航班會因熔断而取消。好消息接踵而至，但願我們在各個項目均可以成功迎來3年內首個完整的賽季。

由於休刊的關係，過去幾個月未能在此提供有關 **Sportsman's Bar 改造工程** 的最新消息。工程現正順利進行，目標完工日期為12月中，當然我們也希望工程能夠盡快完成，但除了要面對新冠各個疫情引起的供應鏈受阻，完成工程後仍需獲得監管機構審批，上述因素皆有機會影響工程進度。不過可以肯定的是，有了全新的廚房設備後，在 Sportsman's Bar 全面重開時，大家的整體體驗將更上一層樓，全新的設施將為本會未來幾年的發展注入強心針。

而另一個同樣重要的計劃是主球場 **LED 泛光燈照明系統改善工程**，當大家收到本期會刊的時候，本會與賽馬會共同協助升級主球場的泛光燈照明系統的工程已經展開。工程將分兩階段進行，首先會更換 Forsgate Stand 的泛光燈，緊隨其後是 South Stand 的泛光燈，儘管球場在這兩個階段均會失去 50% 照明系統，餘下 50% 照明系統的照度亦足以維持欖球部及足球部季前訓練所需的燈光。

此外，本人很榮幸能夠出席 6 月 20 日的 **員工頒獎儀式**，頒發 **年度最佳員工及長期服務獎**。員工一向是本會的支柱，大家能夠在本會得到無數歡樂，全賴員工努力不懈的工作，因此他們的付出理應得到肯定。另一邊廂，本會於 7 月 14 日舉行了期待已久的 **25 年會員榮譽酒會**。因為社交距離措施的緣故，晚會由去年順延至今，當日有逾 40 位長期會員出席晚會。我們亦藉此機會邀請與本會同行超過 45 年的會員，以感激他們對本會長久的支持，當中 Tony Carroll、Dermot Agnew 及 Peter Olsen 三位會員的會齡都已經達到 50 年，成就顯著。這些活動過去 3 年因種種原因而受阻，現在能夠有員工及會員參與如此特別的盛會，實屬喜事。

最後，大家於 7 月 25 日應已收到有關啟用 **網上預約體育設施系統** 的通訊，會員現在除了以電話或親身到體育櫃檯預約設施外，還可透過網站預約。本期雜誌亦會有網上預約系統的使用指南，絕對易學易用。

一如以往地，祝大家身體健康。


SPORTS FACILITY BOOKINGS AT YOUR FINGERTIPS

After two and a half years of no international hockey, coach **Arif Ali** led the Hong Kong Women's Hockey Team to the gold medal in the Women's Asian Games Qualifier, held 6th to 14th June in Jakarta, Indonesia. As a result, the team qualified for the upcoming Asian Games.

The number one aim for the squad in this tournament was to qualify for the Asian Games. But we were shooting to be top 2, as our ambition is to dominate the second tier of Asian hockey. However, the lead-up to the tournament did not quite go according to plan. Due to the fifth wave Covid lockdown, the pitches were closed for three months which certainly affected our preparations. Although we could not physically be on the pitch as a squad, we had video sessions to analyse our opponents, and learned about and bonded with our teammates. The team was also very self-disciplined and went on different kinds of fitness training in small groups set by our S&C coach **Chris Marshall**. Once the pitches were reopened, we trained almost every day. There were weeks where we played 6 friendly games in seven days. Turns out all our hard work paid off, as we won five consecutive matches out of the six matches played and were crowned "Champions". Everything was surreal when we lifted that trophy.

in difficult times and our ladies have proven that," says Ali. Winning against Kazakhstan 4-0 was the best result we have had in the 10 years I have played for Hong Kong, yet the most memorable game in the tournament was against Indonesia. Despite a lot of our girls suffering from diarrhoea(!), the game was very exciting in the first half with both teams attacking and defending - 0-0 at half time. In the second half, **Katy Mountain** scored a penalty stroke for us and we took the lead. Not long later, I received an aerial on the right hand side and ran into the D to score near the baseline with a flick. The game ended with the first international goal from **Vivian Lee** in the last 10 seconds of the game. Ken and Chappie dubbed it a 3-0 win to Club.

After 7 days of draining quarantine, the team has rested and resumed training again. We will be working hard

to prepare for the upcoming 2022 Asian Games in Hangzhou (while Katy (aka grandma of the team) is enjoying her world tour).

FROM THE CHAIRMAN**NEW STRUCTURE FOR YOUTH RUGBY**

You may notice that the terms “Mini Rugby” and “Colts Rugby” have disappeared (are disappearing). The Rugby Section has decided that a better structure is required to create a smooth, single pathway for all young athletes from 2 years until they join the Seniors. That new structure is simply referred to as “Youth Rugby”.

The restructuring will ensure no “bump” from U12G / U12 (the last year for what was Minis) into U14G / U13 (the first year of Colts). It also sends into history the anachronistic term Colts: being a young male horse, it was inappropriate to encompass our growing community of girl athletes! We will have a single coaching programme created by the new Head Coach and implemented by Logan with Steve, though our Pro Coaches and Volunteer Parent Coaches.

INTERVIEW WITH

ANTONIO LEE RE DAVIS CUP

For my last contribution to the monthly magazine, I have decided to interview my good friend Antonio Lee. I would love to compete in it again, just because I would like to see how much I have developed and matured in a year."

Was the Davis Cup more stressful than all your other competitions, and how did you overcome the stress?

"Yes it was, as playing for something

more than yourself is always stressful. I was playing for Hong Kong, a place that has made me who I am, and obviously for all Hong Kong has given me, I didn't want to let it down. I just told myself to try my hardest and to have no regrets. You cannot control the outcome, but you can always control your effort."

Lastly, who is your favourite tennis player?

"I don't really have a favourite player, but I try to learn different tactics and techniques from the top players on tour."

Length is not an issue either as proved by **Mike Crean** who holed out from 517




