



s a result of this strong relationship the current U18 Hong Kong National Team Captain, Timothy Chow, was invited to train in Glasgow with the Rangers Academy.

An extraordinary opportunity for a Hong Kong born and bred kid, Tim has made 20 appearances for the HKFC 1st team at the tender age of 17. He had the opportunity to train in May 2022 with Rangers during their Hong Kong visit and did well enough to be invited for a week's training in Glasgow in December 2023.


The experience of seeing and being involved in an elite professional environment will be invaluable in his future development.

I've coached Tim since he was 14 years old and Covid robbed him of the chance to win titles at the U16 and U18 level. The absence of genuine

competitive football during those years has not prevented him in progressing to be the best 17 year old player in Hong Kong. I believe he will only continue to improve and if he shows the level of hunger and dedication he witnessed at The Rangers Academy then his future is bright.

We hope to build on this experience and further extend our working relationship with Rangers in the future. They will be visiting us again in May 2024 for the 25th anniversary of the HKFC 7s. David McCallum will lead them once again and I'll leave you with a few words from David himself.

"We have a long and rich history with the Hong Kong Football Club. It was fantastic welcoming both Monty and Tim to the Academy Training Centre. We have known Monty a long time and having seen Tim play last year we were happy to see him join us for a week's work. He is a good player and a good kid.

The standard of the HKFC
Tournament is first class as is the event organisation. The journey to the Far East is an incredible learning experience for our young players. Exposure to a different climate and culture is extremely beneficial.

We look forward to playing in front of all our fans in Hong Kong and we know how well the HKRSC will look after us too. The Hong Kong based supporters always go above and beyond to take care of us as do all the people at the HKFC. See you all soon."

Tim's itinerary for his week at the Glasgow Rangers Academy was as follows:

Saturday, 9th December

I picked Tim up at Glasgow Airport and we drove straight to Ibrox for the home match against Dundee. He bought himself a scarf and celebrated with the Union Bear in the Broomland Road end of the stadium. A 3-1 victory for Rangers included a goal for Tim's hero, Rangers Captain and fellow right back, James Tavernier.

Sunday, 10th December

A rest day for Tim in preparation for the following day when training would begin. A Sunday roast and Celtic losing to Kilmarnock put him in a good mood.

Monday, 11th December

We arrived at the Training Centre at 8am and whilst I attended the morning U18 staff meeting, Tim got into his kit and met the U18 squad. Breakfast in the Player's Canteen followed and then a Coach and players meeting to outline the schedule for the day. It was a brutal start as the U18 squad were taking a variety of Fitness Tests ahead of the Winter Break. Tim performed above the average which was impressive. In the afternoon we were out on the pitch working on some defensive patterns then straight home for a well earned rest.

Tuesday, 12th December

Another 8am start and also a step up in level. Tim now joined the Rangers B squad and they were preparing for an away fixture in Spain against Real Betis. The speed and intensity was up another gear and once again he responded to the challenge by performing well.

Wednesday, 13th December

Only a morning session today as the B squad flew with the 1st Team squad to Seville. Tim was performing well and also finding out exactly what happens ahead of a big European away match in terms of behind the scenes logistics. The early finish also gave us the chance to have a home cooked meal at my mum's. Her cooking put mine to shame.

Thursday, 14th December

We were back in with the U18 squad as they prepared for a home match against Hearts. Some patterns of play in an 11v11 set them up and they'd go on to beat Hearts later in the week 1-0.

Thursday night was Real Betis v Rangers. The B team unfortunately lost 2-0 in the afternoon so we were a bit nervous sitting down in front of the TV for the main event given Rangers had never beaten a Spanish side on Spanish soil. Tim pointed out that when we (yes that's a direct quote) won the Cup Winners Cup in 1972 in Barcelona it had been against Russian opposition. He was already emotionally attached to the Mighty and Famous Glasgow Rangers and joined myself and my pal Craig in celebrating wildly as Rangers destroyed Real Betis 3-2 in Seville to reach the last 16.

Friday, 15th December

It was a day off from training and Tim flew down to London on the first flight from Glasgow to take part in a series of showcase matches in front of US College Scouts. He flew back up to Glasgow on the last flight having performed well. No surprise given the intense level of training he had under his belt throughout the week.

Saturday, 16th December

He completed the week's training back in with the B squad who worked on crossing and finishing. Robbie Fraser the Rangers B Captain presented Tim with a signed shirt and he also got the chance to meet the Rangers Captain, James Tavernier.

It was the end of an incredible week. The opportunity of a lifetime. Tim was a fabulous ambassador for the HKFC both on and off the field. He performed well and the experience will surely mean his future in football is going to be an exciting and successful one.

I'd personally like to thank Glasgow Rangers and particularly Davie McCallum the Head of Professional Development and B squad as well as U18 Head coach Stevie Smith.


rattled England and the lead was extended by Snelder, Leddel and Snelder again.

INTERVIEW WITH RACHEL TELFORD AND ZENIA WONG

How does it feel to represent Hong Kong in your first Opens tournament?

Zenia: "Absolutely amazing! It feels like a full-circle moment as I started my netball journey in the U14s Academy, and the team was so supportive and welcoming throughout the entire preparation process and tournament."

Rachel: "It's quite surreal being able to represent Hong Kong in this tournament. I've grown up watching the Hong Kong team play in this competition back when it was the Tri-Nations and remember being in awe of all of the players on the team, wondering if I'd ever have the ability to do the same one day. To have this opportunity to play my favourite sport and represent Hong Kong is something I'm incredibly grateful for."

What training was involved to prepare the team?

Rachel: "As a team, we would

have weekly team training as well as netball targeted gym sessions with Joint Dynamics. All of the team also played in the Ladies League and getting to play games once a week was also very helpful. Personally, having HKFC training on top of Opens training was beneficial for me to ensure my netball skills and fitness were up to scratch."

How do you mentally prep for matches?

Zenia: "Closing my eyes and visualising myself doing positive things on court such as hitting the circle edge and feeding calmly. Reminding myself my goals and that I got this!"

Rachel: "Within the hour before the match, I think it's very important to get into a good mood and hype up with the team before warm-up to ensure you step onto the court with the right attitude."

Memorable moment(s) of the tournament?

Rachel: "It's very difficult to choose moments because there were just so many! Some of my favourite moments came from rewatching games and strategising with my teammates, especially my roommate (Zenia!) and the middies unit. Playing against other countries, who have different types of experience and styles of play compared to what I'm used to in Hong Kong, was also very memorable!"

Zenia: "The opening ceremony and seeing our friends and family in the crowd, cheering on the HK Men's at their Challenge Cup game against Pakistan."

Most challenging part?

Rachel: "This tournament was definitely physically challenging. I've never really experienced playing games at this intensity back to back, so overcoming the physical tiredness and soreness, especially towards the end of the tournament, was a challenge."

Who's your tournament MVP?

Zenia: "My roommate Rachel - she was relentless in defence and turned over lots of ball, and stepped up when the team needed it!"

Rachel: "My tournament MVP is our captain Ann Lo! I think she did an amazing job in the defensive circle and took the opportunities to hunt for the ball. Many of those opportunities led to some great turnovers for our team. As primarily a defender myself, I really admired her energy and willingness to go for every ball this tournament."

Anything you'd like to share with aspiring netball players?

Rachel: "Keep learning, believe in yourself, and remember why you play. Always be open to learning, from your coaches, teammates, players you look up to, or even watching yourself back. If you have a goal for where you want to be as a player, put yourself out there and believe you can achieve it. And what I think is most important, remember why you love netball (for me it's because I have a lot of fun and I love being able to play as part of a team)! It really helps to remind yourself when you're feeling less motivated."

Zenia: "Don't be afraid to ask your coaches for feedback and put effort in working on those areas and believe in your ability even when things get difficult! You might encounter heartbreaking losses throughout your journey and it's normal to feel upset but always pick yourself back up, communicate with your teammates and focus on the next game. Most importantly - have fun and cherish the off-court friendships you make! And always warm-up properly and strap your ankles!"

INTERVIEW WITH ASSISTANT COACH VERONICA ARNOLD



The mens have had a number of international matches this season, how does it feel to represent Hong Kong again?

Veronica: "Singapore Nations Cup and then HK Challenge Cup vs Pakistan. Feels good to be involved with the international scene again. Having had a rest, I feel I have recuperated my energy so have enjoyed it. The men's team was something different for me from U21s and Womens so it was also interesting too."

What do you think the national team has achieved from the challenge cup?

Veronica: "Raised the profile in HK which is important, and for the men that were directly involved, pride and the belief in themselves."

We currently have a total of 12 teams participating in the JNL with 5 of the U12-U19 teams competing in the Premiership in the second half of the season.


With matches only starting on 25th February 2024, the Junior League is well underway with their training that started in early January already. We are excited to see how the teams progress this year in their new divisions.

ust a few days after playing at Deep Water Bay, we headed back to the golf course. Our venue was at the KSC North Course.




