appy Lo was born and raised in Hong Kong China and at 9 years of age, she started following John Leung, current badminton team coach in HKFC as her technical advisor. With the comprehensive training facility in HKFC and individualised technical sessions, Happy's skills and game tactics have gradually matured to prepare her for the challenges that may come next.

When Happy turned 18 years old the Covid pandemic almost crippled her badminton career and the opportunities to participate in any competition were virtually non-existent. This had become an opportunity for Happy to focus on her studies, preparing to arrange an exit if her badminton career could not materialise. Fortunately, the pandemic eventually went away and she finally completed her matriculation examination. Soon after, she has immersed herself wholeheartedly as a full-time professional badminton

player with the national team. She trains 6 days a week at Sports Institute and comes to HKFC for her technical sessions on weekends as well as sparring with the young players.

Her road to Paris cannot be taken light-heartedly because she does not only compete against herself, but she must also beat other competitors to their Olympic points for the final qualification. Therefore, Happy has to grasp every opportunity and tolerate all unfavourable conditions in order to secure the points. Happy had to endure numerous food-poisoning incidents multiple sprained ankles during practice and tournaments due to slippery floors. tolerated long-haul flights and at times each flight might be over 30 hours to There were also threat of bombing and physical demand of high altitude in Iran.

A new chapter has now begun for Happy, and her achievement only affirms the support from Hong Kong Football Club on the junior badminton development program.



JUNIOR TOURNAMENTS REPORT







Here is another exciting month for the HKBA Mixed and Double Leagues progressing towards the last 16 elimination round. The following teams are composed of juniors and veterans in the Grade E category.

#### **HKFC MIXED TEAM**

The last 16 games for the Grade E mixed team was held on Sunday, 21st April 2024 at Po Kong Village Sports Centre against 凡星A. The team won by a wide margin of 8:1 and will enter quarter-finals on 28th April 2024.

#### **HKFC JUNIOR LADIES' TEAM**

The ladies' team was composed of players from only 12-15 years, and they had put on an unbelievable performance that got them to the last 16. On 21st April, they played against Sinsport, another local club

and lost 0:6. The girls will return stronger next year.

#### **HKFC JUNIOR MEN'S TEAM**

The match of men's team in the last 16 was a nail-biting performance from HKFC junior players. The opposing team 邱張軍 is also a team composed of young competitive adult players. The games were very tight and HKFC was losing 4:5 in the overall number of matches. However, according to the rules and regulations of doubles league, the team will need to win by not only number of games, but also the sum of scores from all the matches. Unfortunately, HKFC team lost by a close total score of 166:168 and graduated in last 16. This is a valuable experience for the boys, and will come back more prepared next year.

#### TEAM COACH REPORT

HKFC junior program has been thriving for over 10 years since I was on board. I have witnessed the astonishing growth of and it is especially rewarding to see that Happy Lo Sin Yan, who has been with HKFC since age 9, finally made it to the Olympics. Other junior talents in the program continue to flourish in various schools and local leagues and tournaments. The performance of the 3 league teams which composed of mostly U18 players have demonstrated their ability to compete with adults in the open age leagues. I am also looking forward to the first overseas junior team from Malaysia and Taipei will be showcasing their junior players and our players will definitely benefit from the experience.





#### Was competing at the Olympics a childhood dream?

"Absolutely! I used to daydream about competing at the Olympic Games when I was a child, but at that time I imagined that I would be swimming as that was my first sport. I even used to think about what I would say in my post race interviews! That dream came a little closer to reality when I attended an Olympic Youth camp for triathlon in Northern Ireland when I was 14 and had the opportunity to meet some athletes that had competed in previous Games."

## When and how did you know that you were going to compete? Or what lit the fire for the Olympics?

"I was selected to be part of an Irish training squad whose main objective was to have more Irish athletes qualifying for the Olympic Games Marathon. That gave me the belief that I was good enough to run in the Olympics. I ran 2:36:11 in my second ever marathon in Rotterdam in 2012 (the 2nd fastest of the 4 Irish girls having achieved the qualifying standard of sub 2:37), so I knew I was in with a very strong chance of being selected but I received the call officially declaring me as part of the Irish Olympic team in May 2012 while I was on training camp in Portugal. I was ecstatic!"

### How did you train for the 2012 London Summer Olympic Games?

"We expected the weather to be warm, so I spent alot of time on training camps in Portugal. There was a great group of athletes there with fantastic facilities including a running track, gym (for strength work) and miles and miles of trails. I was there with another Irish girl that had qualified in the marathon, so we did alot of training in the heat together to prepare for London."

# CAITRIONA JENNINGS, LONDON 2012 OLYMPICS

With Paris 2024 Olympics Games around the corner, the Swim & Triathlon Society is publishing a series of interviews with Olympians amongst us. This is the first of the series with Caitriona Jennings who represented Ireland competing in the Olympic Marathon event in 2012. Since then she has continued to scale new heights in the sport with Ultra Runner of the Year Award from Athletics Ireland in recognition of Caitriona's achievements of winning the 50km European Championships and placing 3rd in the 100km World Championships. She set new Irish records for 50km (3:19:42), 100km (7:07:16) and 50 mile (split in 100km of 5:42:38). Her performance at the 100km World Championships also secured a World Gold (Masters) and new Over 40 World Record for 100km.

#### Please share a fun fact at the Olympics!

"The dining room in the Olympic Village in London sat 5,000 people, and was big enough to park 80 London buses inside. It was enormous... and a great place to spot many famous athletes getting their pre-competition and post-competition meals."

# Competing before the world stage appears to be in the family DNA. Do you and your sibling compete against each other?

"Yes Myself and my sister (who finished 6th in the LW2X rowing event in the Rio Olympics) are fierce competitors... luckily I still have the edge when it comes to running and she definitely ranks supreme in rowing and cycling! Her husband is also a double-Olympian, so you could say that friendly board games at Christmas become pretty fierce!"

#### How do you balance your family, work and training?

"Although it can be challenging at times, I always manage to find a way as each one is so very important to me. Ultimately, training at a high level requires significant organisation and discipline... and I usually have to sacrifice certain things (mainly sleep) to fit everything in. But I train because I absolutely love competing and running is just part of me at this stage!!"

## What is your advice to budding athletes who want to perform on a world stage?

"Believe in yourself and follow your dreams. It may seem unattainable at times, but just keep showing up every day and work hard, and you will achieve what you set your mind to. Of course it will be difficult at times and there will be setbacks along the way, but don't let that derail your dreams. Shoot for the sky and you will reach the clouds!"

# RESULTS FROM OUR LATEST ASA MEET

n 28th April, 10 of our swimmers participated in the Hong Kong Long Course Masters Swimming competition with 14 individual and 4 relay events, with an impressive total of 11 gold medals (3 of which for the highly anticipated relay races) and 5 silvers collected at the event.

Not only was the medal collection outstanding at this competition, a total of four Hong Kong records were broken by our teammates **Craig Nortje** (who achieved not only the 100m Backstroke record but also the 200m Freestyle record on the same day – category Men's 45-49 with an additional gold medal in the 200IM for good measure), **Alex Fong** (200m Freestyle, category Men's 40-44) and **Peter Inglis** (50m Butterfly – category Men's 70-74). Huge congratulations to these swimmers!

Our ladies **Christina Sjoholm** and **Farah Master** both achieved gold medals with excellent swims in their respective age groups for the 100m Backstroke and the 200m Freestyle, and also both contributed to the additional silver medal achieved in the 4x50 Women's Medley Relay joined by teammates **Janet Wu** (who also won silver in the 50m Butterfly) and **Angie Fong**.

**Chris Cheng** also won a gold medal in a speedy 50m Butterfly, with **Shek Pui Lo** (200m IM) and **Braedon Sharp** (200m Freestyle and 50 Butterfly) collecting more silvers for the men's team. Competitive freestyle races were also swum by **Shane Davis** (200m) and **Shek Pui Lo** (50m).






