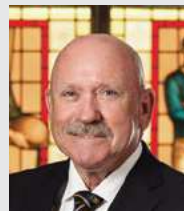

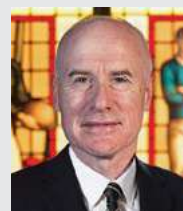

FUNCTION: to review of the Club's Articles of Association, Bye-laws and Policy Statements to keep them relevant and useful. Monitor and review the constitutions/Bye-laws of all Club bodies for consistency. Standardise signage, notices, forms and provide advice on constitutional aspects are additional responsibilities. Finally, to take action on misconduct complaints to ensure compliance with the Bye-laws for the enjoyment of all Members.

DEVELOPMENT – Kenneth Ng

FUNCTION: to identify and evaluate suitable development initiatives for the Club's facilities in the short, medium, and long term, and to recommend selected proposals to GC for consideration and subsequent implementation.

MEMBERSHIP – Don Rider

FUNCTION: to oversee the admission of new Members, to monitor existing policies and to advise on membership-related matters, including procedures (including Sections) and compliance with these policies.

SPORTS AND RECREATION – John Thompson

FUNCTION: to promote and support the development of recognised sporting activities and competitive recreational activities for members, also collaborate with management to maximise the utilisation of the Club's sports facilities.

MAJOR EVENTS – Mia Williams

FUNCTION: to work with the event organising committees, provide assistance and support to ensure a coordinated and consistent approach to sponsorship contracts and event administration, and provide timely reports on major events to the GC.

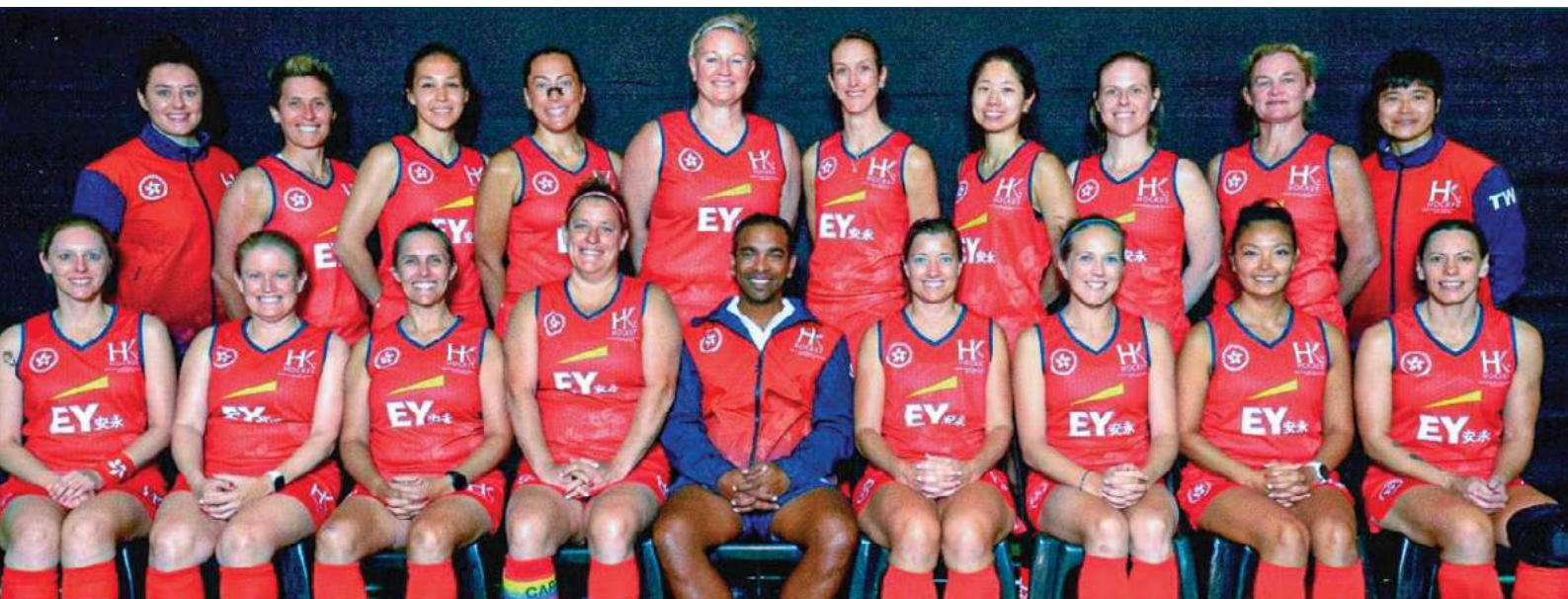

2024 WORLD MASTERS HOCKEY WORLD CUP CAPE TOWN AND AUCKLAND

In October 2024, the Over 35 Ladies World Cup Hockey tournament in Cape Town served as a platform for the Hong Kong team to showcase their talent and spirit on the global stage. Representing the Hong Kong Football Club, a group of skilled and dedicated players were selected to compete, led by the experienced duo of Captain **Sam Hill** and Vice-Captain **Leigh Cumings**.

The squad, comprising **Nicola Bruce, Hannah Wright, Emma Sturgess, Hannah Duley, Charlie Webb, Sophie Lindsay, Jasmine Titmuss** in goal, **Dawn Strachan** and **Claire Watson**, brought a mix of experience and enthusiasm to the tournament. Each player was a vital piece of the team, contributing their unique skills and determination to Hong Kong's campaign in Cape Town.

From the opening match against the Netherlands, where **Leigh Cumings'** goal showcased the team's fighting spirit despite a 1-5 loss, to the hard-earned draw against Australia with an equaliser from **Hannah Duley**, the Hong Kong team demonstrated resilience and determination in the face of formidable opposition.

Their breakthrough came in a thrilling encounter against the USA, where **Dawn Strachan** and **Claire Watson** found the back of the net to secure a confident 2-0 victory. This win not only boosted the team's morale but also highlighted their ability to compete at the highest level.

As the tournament progressed, the team faced tough challenges, including a heartbreaking 0-1 loss to Ireland in the final minutes and a narrow 2-3 defeat against Wales, where **Leigh Cumings**

contributed to one of the two crucial goals.

However, the Hong Kong team refused to be disheartened, ending their campaign on a high note with a 2-1 triumph over France in their final game, thanks to the great goals from **Nicola Bruce** and **Hannah Duley**.

The inclusion of the Hong Kong Football Club players in the tournament not only showcased their individual skills but also highlighted the collective strength and unity of the team. Their performances inspired fans and players alike, leaving a lasting impact on the tournament and exemplifying the rich talent and passion within the Hong Kong hockey community. The team's journey in Cape Town symbolised the resilience, dedication and sportsmanship that define the essence of the beautiful game of hockey.





A month later, a considerably older Hong Kong Men's team (Over 50) headed off to Auckland to compete at the 2024 Masters World Cup in New Zealand. This was a team that had achieved Gold Medal success last year at the Masters Asia Cup held at HKFC in November 2023. The HK50 squad is a diverse group of Pakistani, Chinese, English, Scottish, Dutch, South African, German and Kiwi players drawn from six different Hong Kong clubs that bonded over the highs and lows of competing together as Hong Kong, China at the highest level.

The Men's team had tough pool games against South Africa, Chile and Argentina and did not make it to the quarter-finals, but under

Simon Chapman's professional coaching, the team rallied and had more success in their ranking matches, drawing with Australia and then New Zealand before finishing with a solid 9-2 win against Japan.

There was good representation from HKFC in the O50's Hong Kong squad, including **Andy Boulton** ("Boulty"), **Simon Chapman** ("Chappie") as Coach, **Justin Davidson**, **Chris Page** ("Pagey"), **Charlie Poulton**, **Simon Shepherdson** ("Shep Snr") as Player Manager and **Rene Thiel**.

Notably, a few other HKFC members past and present were also competing in Auckland, including Alistair Clark with the International Umpires, **Tim Loh**

representing Canada, **Jun Yokoe** as the Japan team manager and **Jason Parry** representing New Zealand.

The squad played some very good hockey at times and grew together over the whole tournament, and the aim is to build on this momentum into the Asian games in 2025 and the next World Cup in 2026 with hopefully more age groups taking part and even more representation from HKFC members.





IMPACT OF ESSENTIAL HOCKEY GEAR DONATION

5 years ago, a massive clear-out was undertaken and the Hockey Section sent a large donation to the Ustad Umar Hockey Academy in Toba Tek Singh, Punjab. This donation includes hockey balls, goalkeeper equipment (helmets, pads and kickers), training cones and previous season uniforms.

Goalkeeper kits, often prohibitively expensive, have been particularly well-received, enabling young athletes who otherwise couldn't afford such gear to pursue their passion for hockey.

The impact of these contributions is significant. Ali Raza, a player from the Ustad Umar Hockey Academy, has recently been selected to represent

the Pakistan U21 team at the Asia World Cup. The support from HKFC highlights the global spirit of hockey, fostering growth for future stars.

To continue this support, a donation drive is scheduled for the weekend of 11-12th January, where all old kit, including previous season uniforms and any equipment, will be welcomed.

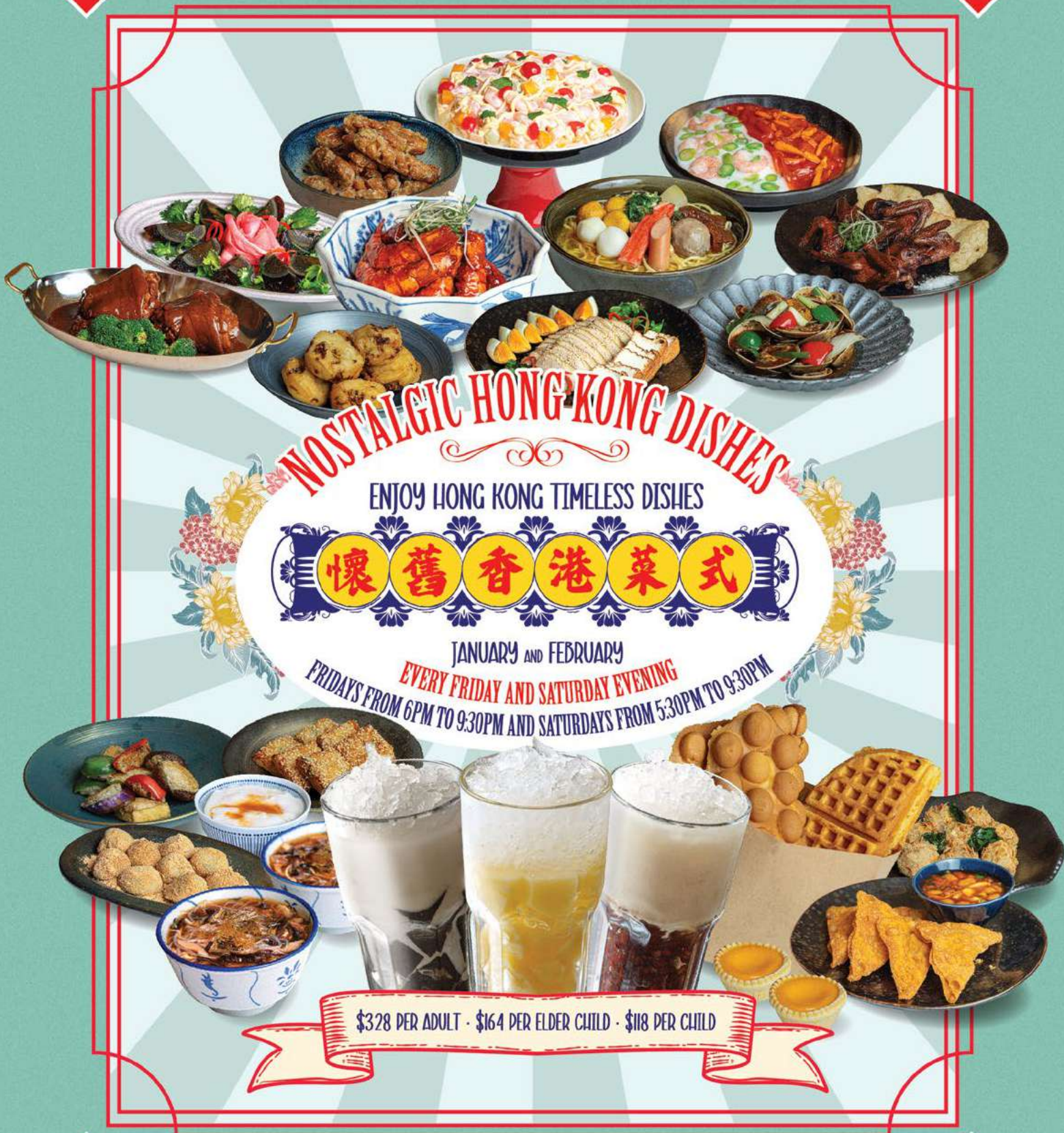

The HKFC Standard Chartered Priority Private Soccer Sevens and Junior Sevens will be upon us before we know

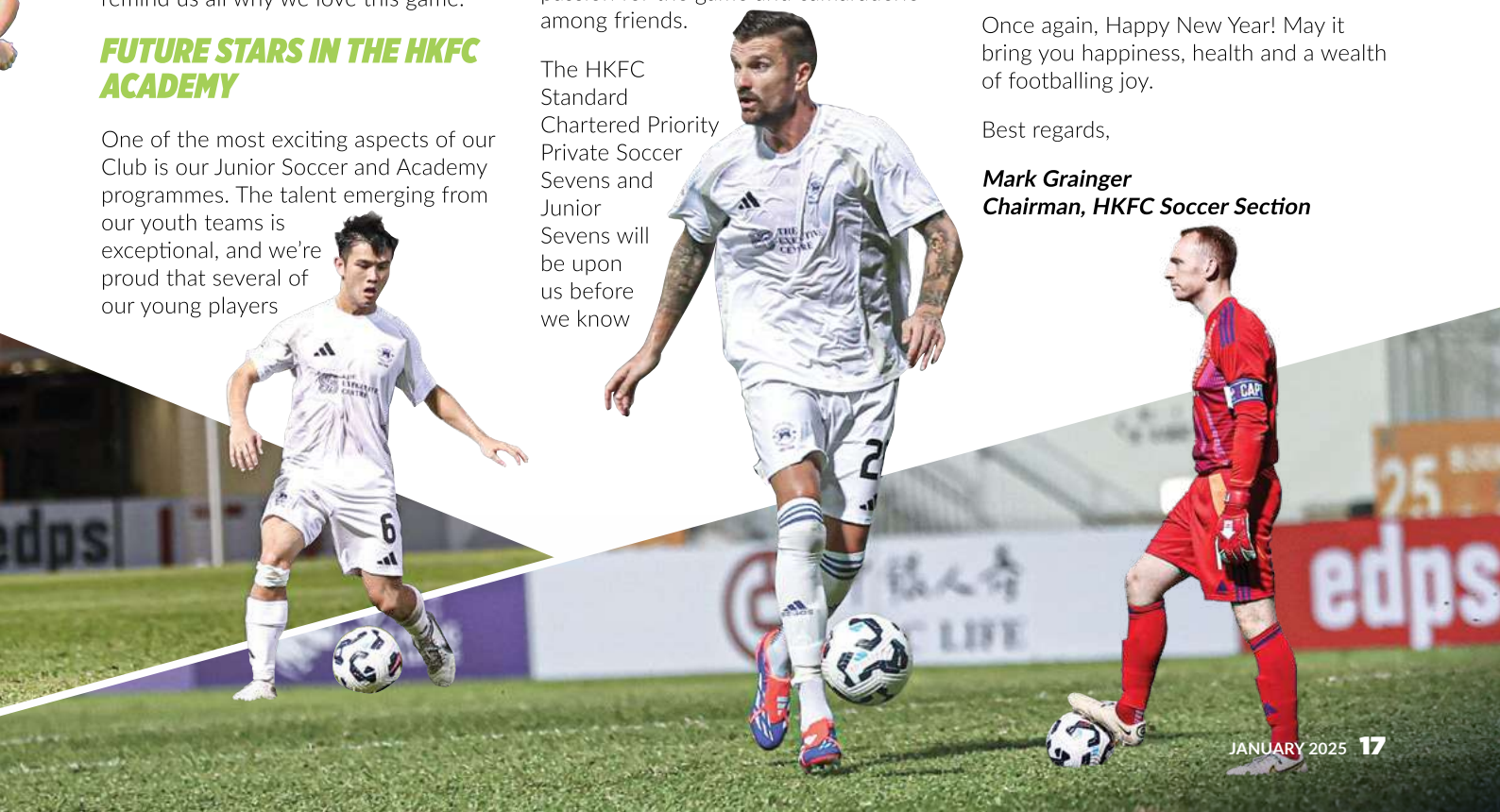
it in May. Invites have already gone out, and I'm pleased to share that a number of professional clubs from the Premier League and other countries have accepted – watch this space!

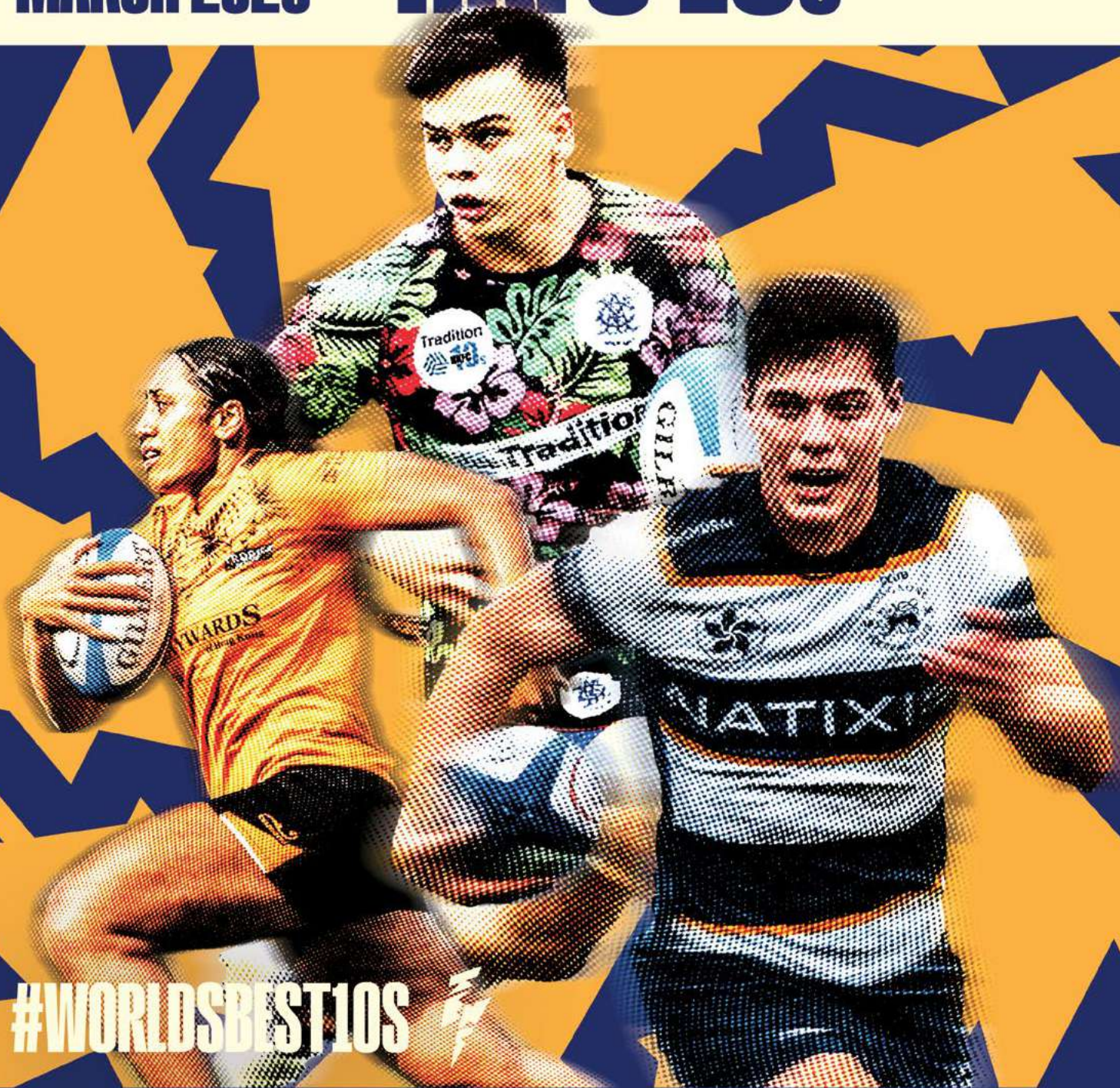

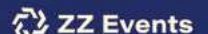

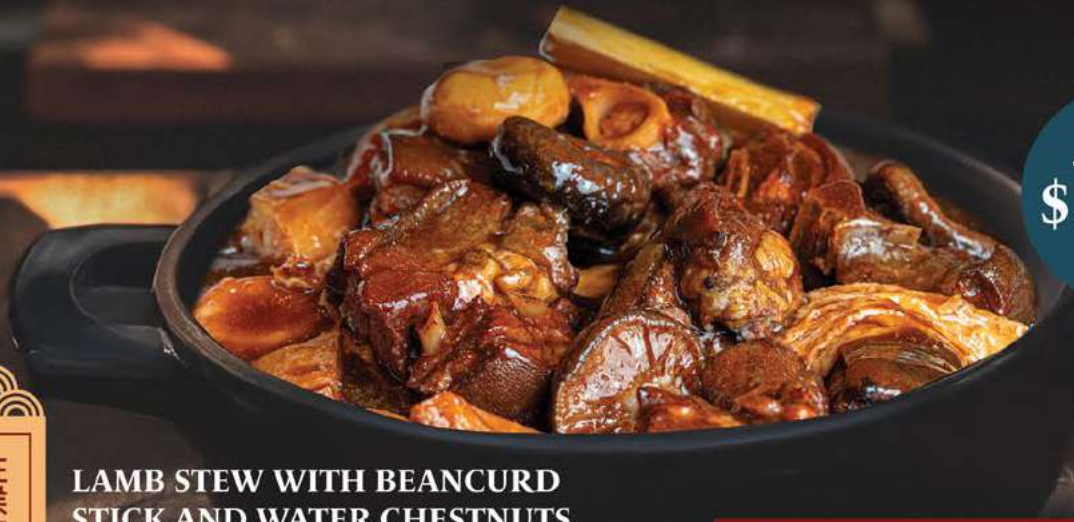

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR FOUNDING MEMBERS: THE BIRTH OF THE SWIMMING & TRIATHLON CLUB

In 2002, a small group of dedicated water enthusiasts came together with a shared dream: to create a community within the Hong Kong Football Club that celebrated the joys and challenges of swimming. This dream gave rise to the Swimming Society, a group that has since grown into one of the Club's most cherished and active sports clubs. The founding members were trailblazers in every sense – **Guy Horne** and **Sheena Ashford-Tait**, and their partners **Jo** and **Duncan**. They recognised the need for a dedicated swimming group within the Club's already thriving sports environment. Their vision was simple yet profound – to promote swimming, encourage camaraderie through regular meets and provide opportunities for members to compete and improve their skills in the water. They were quickly joined by their friends **Alice & Richard Hutchens**, **Tony Lavery**, **David Howells**, **Patrick Ip**, **Kwong**, **Sophie Le Clue** and **Claire Darke**. The Club brought us together in an amazing way and twenty years on, we're all still friends despite being scattered throughout the world. Early coaches included HKFC gym manager **Tonia Peachey**, **James Shortis**, **Lloyd McBean** plus **Joe Wojcik** for triathlon. What started with a few informal lap sessions quickly evolved into a structured team. The founding members worked tirelessly to organise events, secure pool time and create a calendar that balanced

training sessions, social activities and competitions. They raced against the Ladies Recreation Club, Hong Kong Police and Fire Services. Having fireman Kwong as a HKFC swimmer was a distinct advantage that he could swim 100m (4 laps of the pool) without needing to breathe, so would win the underwater races. Hong Kong Olympian **Arthur Li** launched and ran the HKFC Swim Section youth squad pool training sessions, and Commonwealth Games gold medallist **Jo Fargus** cruised through training sessions and adapted to open water competition, effortlessly.

We competed in local triathlons, which resulted in the Club expanding to become a swimming and triathlon club. Laguna Phuket Triathlon was the flagship event. **Richard Hall**

went further and qualified for the Ironman World Championships in Kona, Hawaii. Open Water Swimming took off around 2010 with the first races included the Clean Half Relay to complement the excellent biathlon Splash 'n' Dash series. It all laid the foundation for the vibrant swimming culture that HKFC enjoys today. In those early days, members swam not just for fitness but for the friendships formed poolside. Regular meets, both competitive and recreational, became a hallmark of the society. After training sessions, everyone would gather at the Coffee Shop for dinner – they even had a 'swimming club dinner' on the menu (super healthy salmon, rice and broccoli)! Christmas Socials were in the hands of **Debbie Handley** and were truly unforgettable. The group's commitment to inclusion meant



that swimmers of all abilities were welcome, a tradition that continues with **Michael Sadler** taking over as Section Chair in 2013 when the founders had left Hong Kong. As we reflect on over two decades of the Swimming Society, we owe a debt of gratitude to the founding members for their foresight, passion and dedication. They transformed an idea into a legacy and today, the Swimming Society stands as a testament to their pioneering spirit. Whether you're a seasoned swimmer or just dipping your toes into the water, you're part of a tradition that began in 2002 with a handful of visionaries. Let's honour their legacy by keeping the spirit of swimming alive at HKFC!

Where are those founders now? **Sheena** and **Duncan** are living close to Lake Wakatipu near Queenstown, New Zealand. They remain avid distance and cold-water swimmers and compete regularly in Masters competitions. **Jo** and **Guy** are living in French-speaking Switzerland. During COVID lockdown, **Joanne Horne** instigated a swim group all year round in Lake Geneva. As we write this article, the water temperature is 10°C with snow on the ground. **Guy** joins them occasionally and enjoys open water training in the milder months.

If we've missed anyone crucial or any special moments, please feel free to refresh our memories. A portion of super healthy salmon usually helps the process.

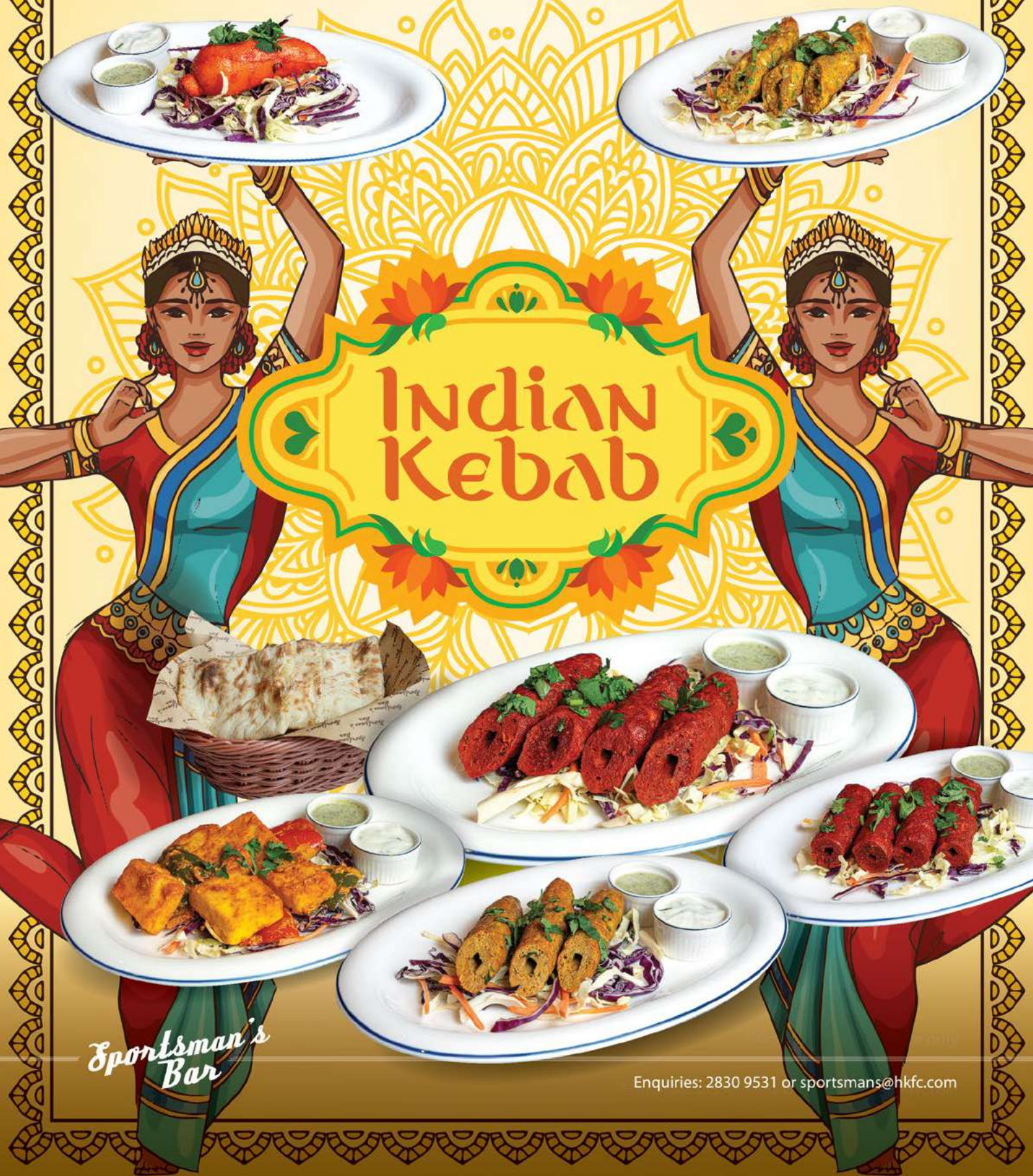

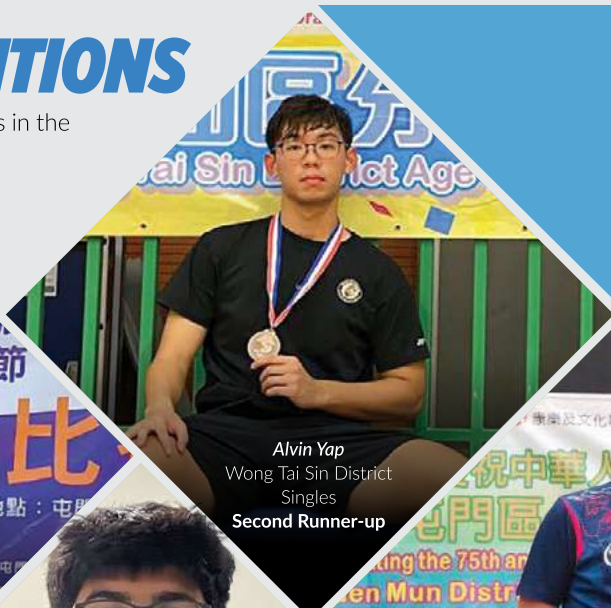

We wish our SPMs the best of luck in their upcoming competitions!

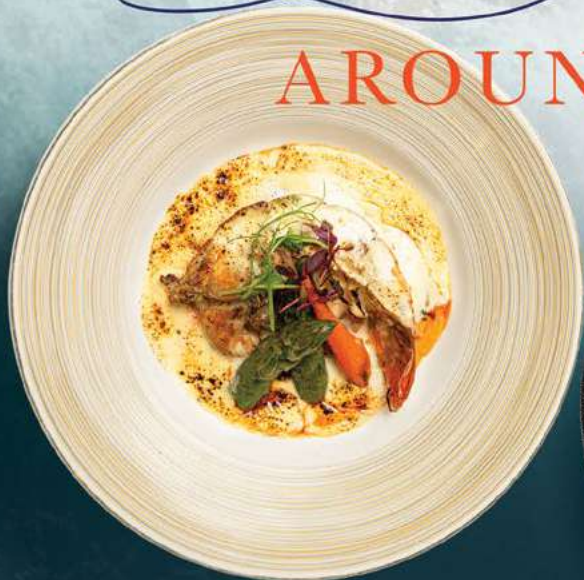
