

The world's best squash players fought for the title of world champions at the Football Club from 9th to 15th December. With nearly 200 athletes competing in teams from 29 nations and regions, this was the first time the world-class event had been held in Hong Kong, and the first edition of the competition to feature both men's and women's championships simultaneously.

USA and England in the finals.

England. Rowan El Araby and Nour El Sherbini delivered a well-earned win after victories over Marina Stefanoni and Olivia Weaver.

USA's World No.38 Stefanoni caused Egypt's World No.7 El Araby a number of problems in a great battle, with El Araby

eventually overcoming the spirited 22-year-old 11-6, 12-10, 6-11, 11-9 in 42 minutes.

Up next, Nour El Sherbini and Olivia Weaver played out a second world championship final match against each other. Despite going into the match nursing a back injury that forced her to retire hurt against **El** Sherbini in the semi-final of the Hong Kong Open, Weaver deservedly took the lead tonight, with her

en route to 11-6, 11-7, 11-7 wins to keep the title in Egyptian hands.

In the men's final, both Mazen Hesham and Ali Farag were forced to dig deep and fight back against a fired-up England side who were aiming to end a run of three consecutive final defeats to the reigning champions.

England's World No.35 **Curtis Malik** came out at breathtaking pace in the opener, playing some of the best squash of his career as he took the game to World No.5 **Hesham**, forcing the Egyptian onto the back foot with an 11-4 win.

Hesham saved game ball to level the scores with a 13-11 win in game two but looked uncomfortable, and **Malik** regained the lead with a dominant 11-6 win.

Hesham played his best game of the final in game four, finally consistently beating **Malik's** defences with a combination of patient play and some of his trademark

skill to level the scores again 11-6, before finally getting over the line in an 11-8 win in the decider against the distraught **Malik**.

In the second match of the final, **Farag** played out another epic encounter with Alexandria-born **Mohamed El Shorbagy**. **El Shorbagy** was in sparkling form for much of tonight's clash, hitting with real ferocity to take a deserved lead through an 11-6 win.

Farag clung on in game two, claiming what felt like a hugely important win via a tie break, 13-11.

Both men continued to throw everything at each other as the title bout wore on, but it was **Farag** who was able to make the telling contribution, clinching the next two games 11-8, 11-9 to ensure Egypt would enter the history books as the first nation to win the combined championships.

Caught up in the emotion of the moment, **Farag** vaulted the back wall and leapt into the arms of his teammates in joy.

The first out for squash was **Carmen Lee** and **Gillem Tulloch** against a strong tennis pairing of **Nathan Booth** and **Alistair Todd**. It was a remarkably close match all the Nathan hit the closest to the pin on the 16th hole but could only three-putt from there to let Gillem in to win the

John Thompson was paired with Alexander Chew for squash vs Colin Lunn and Adrian Long for tennis. The tennis team got out all guns blazing, with **Colin** hitting two with Adrian getting the closest to the pin on the tricky



14th and **Colin** winning the closest to the pin prize on the 3rd. This ended up being too much to get back for the squash pair even though Alexander hit some cracking approach shots and kept the squash pair in the match.

Unfortunately, tennis was very solid all the way through and came through victors with a 6 and 5 win. The third pairing looked on paper to be strong for the squash team, with **Andrew Wood** and **Sammy Li** against **Jenny Chapman** and **Fredrik Atting**. The squash duo dovetailed well throughout, with **Sammy** and **Fredrik** both hitting close approach shots that won them prizes. The squash team were solid and were never down in the tie. They accelerated into the back nine and won the match 6 and 5.

With half of the pairs through, squash was leading two points to one. The fourth pairing had **Steve**Wei and Kien Ng vs Chris Burley and Steve Knight.

There was controversy as Chris had in previous years played for the squash team, but in a LIV like move, he decided this year to cross over to the tennis team. This was a close match throughout, with the squash pair starting well but the tennis duo coming back on the back nine. Coming down the 18th, the tennis team were one up, so squash was trying hard to claw back a much-needed half point. Steve Wei had a putt for the win on the hole, but with a large crowd watching on, he unfortunately could not manage to get it in. The pressure was too much and the following putt was also missed, making the tennis team win the hole and secure the match two up.

In the penultimate round, **Wei Lam** and **Ken Lo** play **Job Tang** and **Mary Soo**. **Wei Lam**, who was the veteran of the team and unbeaten in this event, played well with **Ken**. The teams were neck and neck throughout, never being more than one hole ahead. At the turn, the squash team were one up, but the tennis team dug deep to bring it back and half the match. There was a bit of post-match review of the scores as neither team were sure what the result was.

With the final pairing to come, the match was tied at 2.5 points each. There was a growing crowd of spectators watching the event unfold. Luckily, there were a few cold beers available to calm the nerves.

Nick Shultz and Anthony Ford for squash were playing against Greg Medhurst and Ben Chandler representing tennis. Unfortunately, the new pairing for squash could not quite click in the conditions. The tennis pair played solid throughout and manage to win the final match 3 and 2 to the delight of the watching tennis team.

In summary, the tennis team won by the closest of margins 3.5 vs 2.5 in this ninth edition, so the rather large and heavy trophy goes back to the 3rd floor of HKFC for a year. The squash section is already looking forward to next year and getting the trophy back, especially as the overall scores are now squash three, tennis 3 and 3 draws, which leaves for a mouthwatering 10th edition.

A wonderful day was had by all, many thanks to everyone who played, and the squash section and tennis society for assisting the organisation.







ong Kong China has become the first Asian city to host the World Bowls Junior Indoor Championship, and this prestigious event was held at the Hong Kong Football Club on 2nd-8th December 2024.


PREMIER LEAGUE 2024



We didn't have coaches, and evening sessions were followed up with dinner outdoors at a long table overlooking the pool with the likes of **Guy**, **Sheena**, **Patrick**, **Richard Hall** and **Richard Hutchens**.

Australia, New Zealand and then Hong Kong from 1990. Australia and NZ had their competitions graded entirely on time, i.e. regardless of age or gender everyone swam in a heat according to their time, and swimmers stayed in the water while the next heat was set off. Hong Kong in the nineties had heats graded purely by gender and age, resulting in a very long drawnout competition. I swam with AVOHK initially, training at the Wanchai 50m pool (when it was open air), and 5 or 6 of us swam at the Pan Pacific Masters in Tokyo in 1991 at the Tokyo Olympic Pool with over 3,000 competitors. Hong Kong Masters competitions were generally held at the Victoria Park poo or Sha Tin pool, both open air, and the HKJC 25m pool at the racecourse."

Peter also shares that the greatest benefit of his swimming career has been the enjoyment and the wide range of friendships he has made through the sport across the world. Truly inspirational!






