



n Thursday 23rd May, before the Soccer Sevens tournament, Coaches from one of the visiting teams, Newcastle United, delivered a Coaching 'Clinic' for HKFC's Soccer Section. The event was run by **Chris Moore** and **Graeme Coulson**, A Licence Youth Development Phase Coaches from NUFC's Academy, and was intended to help both our Technical, professional Coaches and volunteer, part-time Coaches from Junior Soccer.

The event was the brainchild of Section Chairman **Mark Grainger** who wanted

to see what our Coaches could learn from the English Premier League clubs competing in the Sevens, and was coordinated with the HK Football Association, whose own staff also attended.

Chris and Graeme ran a session based on Transition from Defence to Attack (TDA), with emphasis on ball possession, forward runs and ultimately finishing on goal. In needing players for the drills, our visiting Coaches used HKFC's PYL U14 squad who benefited greatly from a structured, attacking session that

expanded concepts from possession rondos to a conditioned game, finally finishing with a small-sided game with Goalkeepers. This was followed by a 10-minute Q&A session for Coaches to pick the brains of the professionals!

With 22 players on the pitch and about 30 Coaches watching on, the session was warmly received, and conversations of coaching techniques carried on upstairs at the Sportsman's Dinner over a glass of wine.

After a disappointing 2022-2023 season, the team regrouped and became ever more focused on the new season and that laser-sharp focus never wavered until we were once again crowned champions of the league.

tarting by solidifying the returning players and making several clever recruitments, the Men's Es formed a squad composed of both young talent and seasoned players that focused on a fine balance between a solid defence and potent attack that dominated the league from day one.

Our defence became the team's stronghold this season where the back four's efforts, led by Paul Chan and Dilraj Gill, made easy work for our joint goalkeepers Darren Foo and Jason Man who limited our opponents to only a handful of goals and kept numerous clean sheets across all competitions. The younger players brought agility and relentless energy, while the veterans provided strategic depth and composure. Together, they formed an impenetrable wall that stood firm against all challenges and were rarely troubled. The team ended the season with the best defensive record in the third division and the second-best defensive record across all seven divisions.

On the end, the team's offence was a display of skilful coordination and sharp execution. The youthful players' speed complemented the veterans' tactical positioning and became an attacking weapon that left our opponents trailing. **Derek Siu** and **Jason Hui** never stopped providing potent passes to our strikers and **Kencer Ho**, a new recruit, was the team's top scorer, netting in 17 goals in league competition alone.

Competition was tight all season long, but the team was able to stay on top of the table from the get-go because of the player's dedication and commitment, which ultimately culminated in another team photo on the club's hallowed wall and another trophy in its fabled cabinet.



At the end of this season, we bid farewell to our onion ring loving Darren Foo, our legendary goalie whose contributions have been pivotal to the team's success over the years. His move to Singapore will be a significant change, but his legacy at HKFC E remains untarnished.

Special mention also goes out to our team's efforts in section life. Whilst the season was full of highlights and tough battles on the hockey pitch, we never forgot our roots as the club's social team with strong turnouts across all section activities as well as being a huge supporter of our youth hockey efforts. As with the semi-final, the boys went all in at the start and overwhelmed the Dragons' defence to score an early super try thanks to another line break by **Jesse**. Not to be outdone, winger **Eashan** added another try to his tally to bring the score to 12-0. The last few minutes of the match were nerve wracking as Dragons' counterattacks pushed

us back up against our own tryline, but our backs held the line and gave Dragons no way through. A lastminute turnover from a Dragons' lineout saw lock **Japsher** take off up the blindside and a third try looked set to seal the deal, but Dragons' scrumhalf was able to catch and drag him into touch, and the final whistle blew, but the boys knew the job had been done!

What a result for these boys, especially considering they have only had a few weeks of scrums and lineouts prior to the tour! I am immensely proud of their grit and determination, and their resilience. n 15th May, the sun was shining, water calm and 300+ swimmers ready for the annual Middle Island Challenge at Deep Water Bay. Our swimmers participated in both the 1.5km and the 3.8km, the latter route starting at Deep Water Bay beach and going around Middle Island. Most of our swimmers competed in the 3.8km, but the day got off to an exciting start with **Vasco Van Der Flier** completing the 1.5km in just 21.24 mins, coming 1st in his category and 4th overall.

13 swimmers from HKFC competed in the 3.8km from a mass start. With over 260 swimmers in the water ready to go, our swimmers started to pull away after the first kilometer following the initial stretch from Deep Water Bay towards Repulse Bay, before making a left around Middle Island towards the open ocean. Conditions were perfect with only a few waves on the south side of Middle Island, making it easier to spot and navigate. On the downward straight back to the beach and past Ocean Park, the first few swimmers had broken away.

With Paris 2024 Olympics Games around the corner, Swim & Triathlon Society is publishing a series of interviews with Olympians amongst us. This is the second of the series with Alex Fong Lik-sun who holds many Hong Kong Swim Records, is an accomplished singer, artist and is an inspiration to us in so many ways.



You represented Hong Kong at 11 yrs old? Wow. Can you please tell us about this event?

"I started training from the age of 9. The age-group swimming competitions are very well organised in Hong Kong, so I was fortunate to be able to represent Hong Kong in overseas competitions from a young age. I remember that particular competition was held in Singapore, called Asian Pacific age group swimming championship."

Was competing at the Olympics a childhood dream?

"At the beginning of my training, I did not have such a "big" goal. But as I started achieving results, especially when I broke my first Hong Kong record when I was 15 years old, the goal of participating in the Olympics was next."

When and how did you know that you were going to compete? Or what lit the fire for the Olympics?

"After I broke the Hong Kong record for the first time in 1995 when I was 15 years old, I had the goal of participating in the Olympics, but unfortunately I didn't make the qualification in time for the 1996 Olympics, so this goal persisted for another four years. It was very fortunate to be able to represent Hong Kong in competitions as we had more than one Olympic qualifying competitions. I think I qualified in four events, but ended up participating in three at the Olympics."

How did you train for the 2000 Sydney Olympics?

"In the summer of 1999, with the sponsorship and arrangement of the HK Sports Institute, I went to the Germantown Academy in Philadelphia, USA to train under the renowned coach Richard Shoulberg. Afterwards, in order to continue my training and with the plan to further my studies in the US, I enrolled at the same school, attending classes while continuing my training, and graduated a year later."







Please share a fun fact at one of the Olympic Games?

"The Olympic Games are like a global village, with people of different races, physiques and characteristics representing different sports. For example, the tallest ones are usually basketball players, while the most slender and petite ones are often gymnasts or divers."

It's very rare to see someone with these two skills, artist and sports. And you are very good at both! How do you balance your life as an artist and a sportsman?

"Entertainment business is my profession. Swimming has now become my hobby. So I must maintain a clear distinction, with work being the priority and hobby second. Given the constraints of the environment, I strive to find time to train. The main reason I continue to train and compete is to challenge the limits of my age. It's a competition with myself and my own body. I feel that participating in sports makes it easier to set goals for myself and achieve them rather than achieve goals in my entertainment business."

What's your advise to budding athletes who want to perform on world stage?

"It's simple, I'm very old school... To compete on the world stage, you need to do what they are doing, and even do it better than them, and put in more effort."


